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A 55-year-old gentleman with schizophrenia presented with right iliac fossa pain of five days duration. Abdominal examination revealed a tender and inflamed area in the right iliac fossa with the tip of a foreign body protruding out from the abdominal wall. Abdominal radiograph revealed a long radio-opaque metal object in the right iliac fossa region. A routine chest radiograph performed as part of pre-operative work-up revealed an abnormality (**Panel**).

What is the diagnosis?
