

Sonali PANDE and Tixon THOMAS

A 31-year-old man presented with pain and swelling of the right knee joint. There was no history of trauma or any systemic symptoms. On examination there was effusion in the knee joint with no local signs of inflammation. The movements were terminally restricted. Plain radiograph did not reveal any significant changes. Approximately 15 mls of blood stained fluid was aspirated for analysis. A magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) of the knee joint was requested (**Panel A**: T2 Sagittal, **Panel B**: GRE Sagittal and **Panel C**: T1FS).

What is the diagnosis and what are the typical features seen on the MRI?
