A 52-year-man with diabetes mellitus for the past 10 years presented with an eight day history of swelling of the left foot. There was no history of fever, pain or preceding trauma. On examination, the left foot was swollen, non-tender and there was local rise of temperature (**Panel A**). The foot pulses were palpable and bounding. There was deformity of the foot and loss of medial arch of the foot. There was no sensation over foot clinically.

What is the diagnosis?
