A middle-aged man presented with a two weeks history of painful right submandibular swelling. This swelling had been slowly increasing in size over the past 10 years but without any history of pain. The pain he experienced was not increased while taking meal. Intra-oral examination showed a hard bony-white coloured mass at the right retromolar trigone (**Panel A**). It was fixed to the underlying structure. An orthopantomogram was obtained (**Panel B**).
